Cross Phase Early Career Framework Programme Year 2



As a Partnership we know that getting the best start for our newest teachers ensures that our children have the best education possible and that high quality teachers are developed, inspired and retained in our classrooms.

The second year of our Early Career Programme develops the early career teachers repertoire and is delivered through a blend of Practitioner Inquiry and case studies, where the ECT and mentor have ownership of the areas of focus within each module. The modules are similar in theme to the first year and there will be opportunities for face-to-face training sessions where EC2s can learn from experienced practitioners and their peers, with self-study reading and reflection to support with their inquiry questions or case studies. Our detailed ECF Overview provides mentors with fortnightly structures and support they need to provide the best

induction possible for their ECTs.

ECT 1 Mentor Training

Session 1

Overview of the ECT programme:
Expectations, being an ECT mentor,

start! This looks at the key things a new
ECT needs as well as how to support the
ECT over the next few months.

Session 2

Testing the temperature: Reflecting on your ECTs progress. What do they need?
How can you best support them?
Supporting pedagogy around memory, metacognition, misconceptions and modeling. This session also develops your feedback skills and not being influenced by false proxies.

Session 3

Evaluating your ECT: Writing the ECT end of year report. How can you best support and prepare you ECT for Year 2? This explores the ECT unit on how they sequence events and dealing with possible issues that ECTs have. It looks at how you prepare the ECT for their first assessment and the discussions that need to take place before this.

Our Programme

Having impact on the practice of others - how do we observe others and give feedback? This session will focus on how to carry out learning walks and observations in an effective and meaningful way. We'll cover the enabling use of feedback and how to take assertive action. This will be an opportunity to reflect on our own observation practice and will be reinforced by a follow-up task in your own school.

Wednesday 4th October 4.00-5.30pm

Implementing change at department or classroom level. How to use research to drive improvement in the classroom or your small team? The focus of this session will be the sequence underpinning effective change. We'll consider the importance of noticing patterns and using data to understand these patterns and performance more precisely. This analysis will then lead to research and an independent project to implement change. Delegates will report on their project in the last session.

Wednesday 22nd November 4.00-5.30pm

Float your boat - What do curriculum leaders do? What is the diet of a curriculum leader? What BASK (behaviours, attitudes, skills and knowledge) are needed for this role? We meet a panel of middle leaders and then encourage you to self-reflect on the attractions and challenges of their roles.

Wednesday 24th January 4.00-5.30pm

Float your boat - What do pastoral leaders do? What is the daily diet of a pastoral leader? What BASK is needed for this role? This is an opportunity to meet and question colleagues with a pastoral role and responsibilities. You will have the opportunity to self-reflect on the attractions and challenges of these roles.

<u>Presenting your project findings - what did you learn about yourself on this journey?</u> How has your work impacted others? This session is dedicated to disseminating the findings from the independent projects. You will assess the impact of your project in your classroom and beyond. Lecture 1: Motivation

Intrinsic motivators can be key to student achievement – but extrinsic motivation dominates many classrooms. Pupil motivation is driven by both intrinsic and extrinsic factors, prior experiences and perceptions of success. Teachers who give students experiences of success build not only motivation but also resilience and belief in their ability to succeed. Join us to explore the balance of extrinsic and intrinsic motivation in schools and to hear some practical strategies for developing intrinsic motivation in your students

Lecture 2: Memory

Improving working memory has been proven to have a dramatic impact on student progress. Join us as we explore working memory and its importance to learning and teaching; what it is, why it's important for teachers and teaching assistants to know about it and how an understanding of working memory can inform the way we teach and support students Monday 27th November 4.00–5.30pm

Lecture 3: Metacognition and self regulation

Research has shown that development and use of metacognitive strategies is linked to exposure and role-modelling from adults in the home and teachers. Where children have not been able to practise these skills at home, the explicit teaching and practice of these strategies becomes even more important in classrooms to reduce variation. Join us to discuss what metacognition looks like in the classroom and how we can develop student's metacognitive skills to make them more reflective and self-regulatory

Lecture 4: Independence and learning

Successful independent learning depends on both external factors (strong relationships between teachers and students, and the establishment of an 'enabling environment') and internal factors (such as cognitive, metacognitive and affective skills related to feelings and emotions.) This lecture addresses which are the most influential factors in supporting students to develop greater ownership of their learning, and how we can encourage student autonomy Wednesday 13th March 4.00-5.30pm

Lecture 5: Adaptive teaching

Using adaptive teaching has been proven to have a huge impact on learning and progress for all. In this lecture we will explore practical strategies behind adaptive teaching, where dynamic pedagogical approaches meet the individual needs and learning styles of every child. MOTO is a cross-phase, exciting, holistic professional learning programme which aims to develop the practice and pedagogy of talented colleagues who want to develop into Outstanding teachers.

The aim of MOTO is to support delegates in becoming Outstanding teachers in their own classrooms and schools; reflecting on the skills, knowledge, attitudes and behaviours of outstanding practitioners, not 'just' how to teach 'outstanding lessons'.


