School Routine



1. Students are allowed into the school building from 8:30.
2. Once they arrive to their form rooms they are able to sort out their bags and use their lockers before registration starts.
3. We have found that students are walking around with all their books in their bags instead of using their lockers or leaving some books at home. For ease please ask them to pack their bags the night before school and only bring in the books they need for that day.
4. P1 starts at 8.45 for and anyone arriving after this time will be marked late.
5. Uniform and equipment is checked by all staff throughout the week. Studies have shown that smart uniform impacts on engagement in lessons.
6. Students should have their name written on all of their property. Students are responsible for all their own belongings, so please remind them to check they have everything before they leave lessons, school and home.
7. Students must always carry a reading book with them at all times.

Attendance Procedures

It is very important students come to school every day and that they are on time.



- If they are absent please **phone, send a message via MyEd app or email the school (contact@sevenkings.school) as early as you can.**
- You must phone **every day** your son/daughter will be off. Medical evidence will need to be provided if the absence is more than 3 days.
- The same procedure apply to religious holidays, please state the religious event being observed.
- Try to make sure your child misses as little school as possible and make appointments out of school time where possible.
- If your child has an appointment please send a letter into school with them that gives details about the nature of the appointment, date and time your child need to leave site. They must then take the card/letter with them to reception and sign out.
- They must never go home without telling anybody.

Punctuality Matters!

Punctuality impacts on organisation, attitude and achievement.

- Supporting your child in evenings and mornings is beneficial.
- It is the students responsibility to make sure they are heading towards their first lesson straight away. We would encourage students to wear watches if they have one at home (no smartwatches allowed).
- In regards to DT ingredients, students should head to school a little earlier to ensure they have enough time to drop it off to their DT classroom.

5 minutes late each day – 3 days of learning lost
10 minutes late each day – 6.5 days of learning lost
15 minutes late each day – 10 days of learning lost
20 minutes late each day – 13 days of learning lost
30 minutes late each day – 19 days of learning lost

Late policy for the whole school per half term
is as follows :

1 Late = 15 minute detention
2 Lates = 30 minute detention
3 Lates = 1 hour detention in IT1

Every time thereafter that a late is received a 1
hour detention is issued for Friday after school.

Form Time Overview

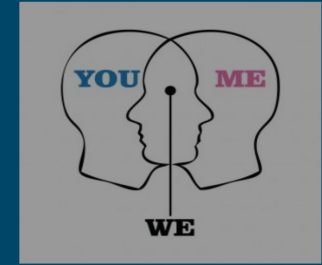

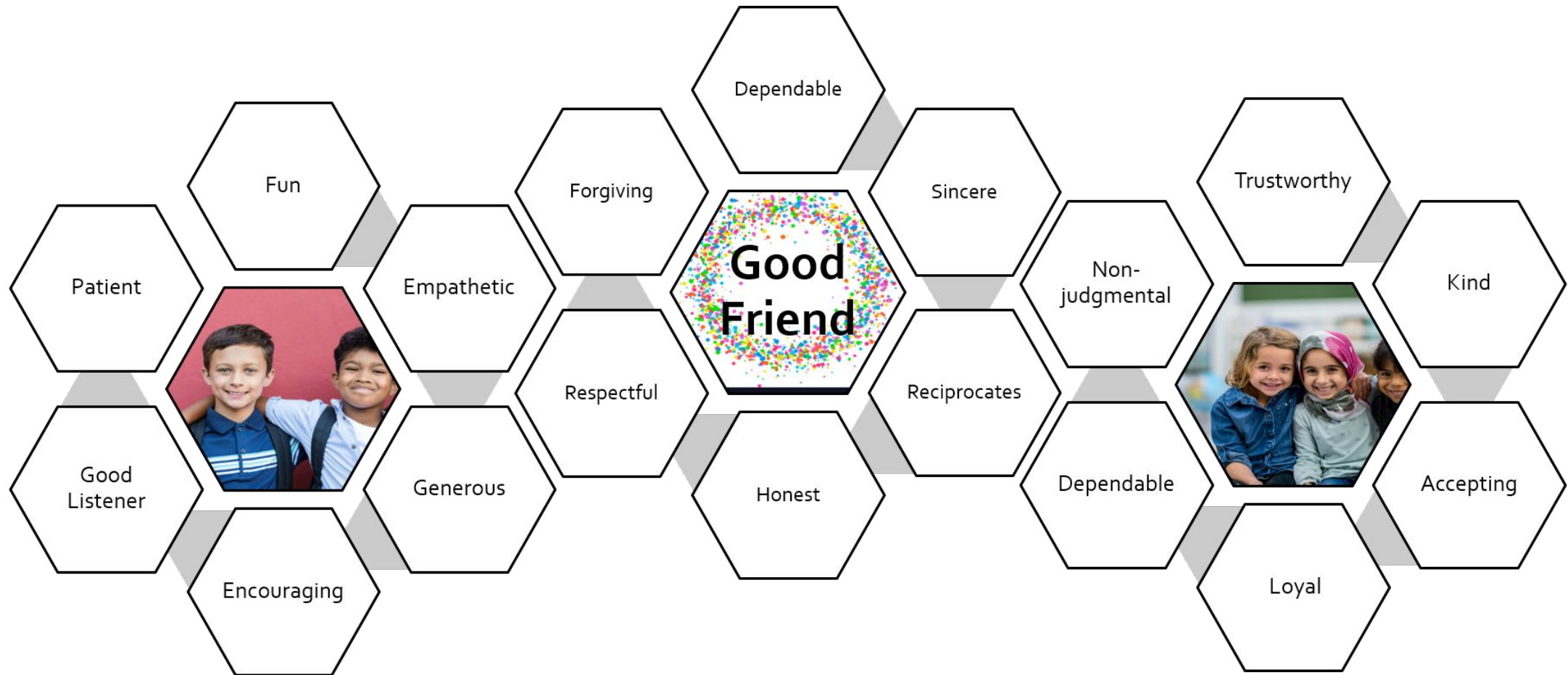
Friendship is a close association between two people marked by feelings of care, respect, admiration, concern, and love.

2. Then with your partner pick 9 of the most important qualities.

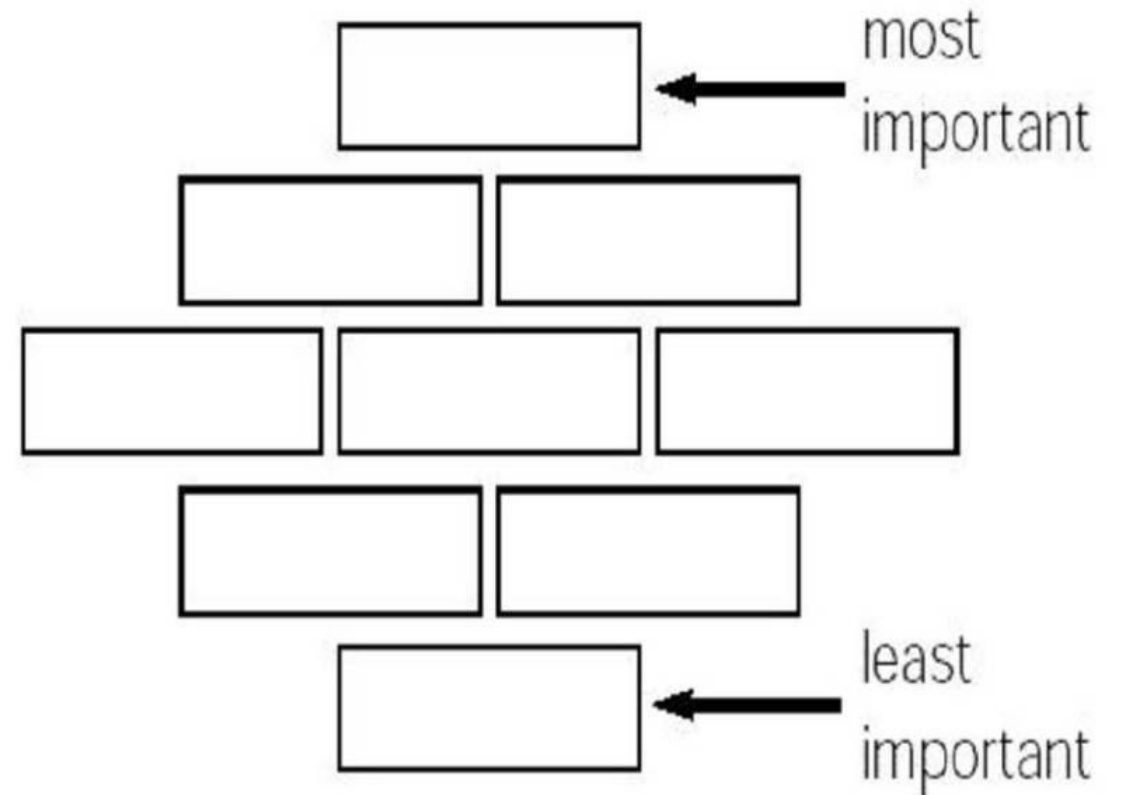


Paired Activity

Follow up activity - Scenario Based

Over the next few slides are going to be a series of scenarios that happen in real life.

You will need to discuss each scenario in pairs and then feedback to the class.

As you are discussing think about the following things:

- How might the person feel?
- What would you do in this situation? (be honest!)
- What should you do in this situation?
- What kind of impact would that have on that person – how might they feel now?

What should you do?

1. You are with your friends and are having a good time, but you see a student sat by themselves...
2. They say that their friend is coming...
3. Their friend has not turned up...
4. You see them sat by themselves again the next day...

Answer

Invite them to hang out with you and if they say they are waiting for their friend in the meantime keep them company.

If you find that this a regular occurrence, why not ask them to join your friendship group or be friends with you. If your group say no - consider whether they hold the qualities of good or unkind friends...

Remember to always have a meeting point e.g the canteen, form class, the front field by the tree etc...
