Dear Families,

Home Learning is an integral and important part of learning for students at Seven Kings. Home Learning encourages pupils to develop the skills, confidence, motivation and self-discipline needed to study effectively as independent and life-long learners as well as consolidating, reinforcing and extending what pupils know, understand and can do at school. Home learning also involves parents and carers in students' learning and keeps them informed about what students are doing at school.

The following guidance should help you support your child in the completion of their home learning. Note that pupils will have a 2-week home learning timetable.

- Each home learning task should last approximately 2 hours to complete over a two week period.
- All pupils are expected to do their home learning to the best of their ability as it will help them to develop the skill of working independently and enable them to build a deeper understanding of the work they have done in class.
- Home learning will not always involve written work. It could be reading, listening, observing, researching or practising a particular skill. It could also involve online learning.
- For each subject, home learning will be set according to the timetable below. Pupils will also be given a date for handing in the home learning which they will record in their planners. Please help your child in planning his or her time so that all the home learning is done by the date it is due.
- Home learning is set through Google Classroom and students will need to regularly check this to know what they are required to complete and when the deadline is.
- Please contact the school if your child is experiencing difficulties with home learning.

In addition, one of the most important things your child should be committing to at home is **reading for pleasure**. There is an ever growing evidence base which shows that reading for pleasure impacts outcomes across all subjects. All students should have a library book or be reading their own book daily. If your child is unsure what to read, encourage them to ask their teachers or Mr Leeming (the school librarian) for advice. There are some suggestions [here](#).
